metaphors and personification.

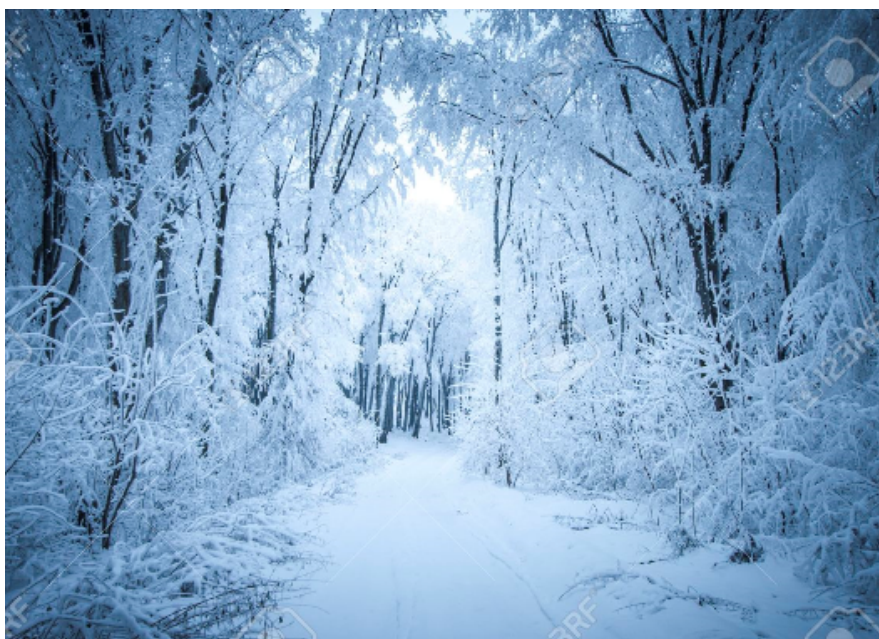
Look at the pictures of winter and collect vocabulary.
