Unit 7: Adding the suffix -ness (2)

Hello again. I'm experiencing a bit of intergalactic dizziness today because I've been whizzing around in the space station to get here on time! Phew. I'm OK now though, and I have one of my special questions for you.

Does the suffix -ness, ness, begin with a vowel or a consonant?

Turn to your partner and then tell me.

After three: one, two, three...

It's a consonant.

That means that for many words we can add the suffix **-ness**, without having to **swap**, **double** or **drop** any letters. Say these words with me.

root word	root word + suffix -ness
kind	kind ness
ill	illness
good	good ness

It is a bit trickier though if the last letter of the root word ends in a consonant + y.

Let's play My turn/Your turn to say these words:



	silly cheeky giddy dizzy chatty
	Before we can add -ness to these words we have to swap the y for an i . Like this: sill y sill iness cheek y cheek iness dizz y dizz iness
	Let's play My turn/Your turn to say the new words. silly silliness dizzy dizziness chatty chattiness cheeky cheekiness
	Remember my tip? When we say these words aloud we cannot really hear the <i>e</i> in -ness To help you to spell these words, say the suffix -n-e-s-s , <i>ness</i> , to rhyme with yes. I hope that helps. Time for me to go now. Goodbye!
