Here are the seven continents of Planet Earth. A continent is a massive piece of land that is often separated from other areas of land by water or another feature such as mountains.




Fascinating Facts





What Is a Landmark?


A landmark makes a place recognisable. This means you could look at a picture of a landmark and know straight away where it is.



A desert is place that has less than 25cm of rain a year. Deserts don't have to be hot – there are deserts in very cold places too. The Sahara Desert is in northern Africa. It is the largest hot desert in the world and stretches across **11 different countries**.

Maasai Mara




Timgad Ruins

Victoria Falls

Victoria Falls is on the Zambezi river, along the border of two countries, Zambia and Zimbabwe. It is one of the world's largest waterfalls. The noise of the water is so loud that it can be heard from almost 40 kilometres away! This is why the falls are known

locally as 'Mosi-oa-Tunya' which means 'the smoke that thunders'.




Animal Facts

- There are over 2600 different types of bird that live in Africa.

The wildebeest, Thomson's gazelle and lion, all of which can reach speeds of 50 mph.

- There are penguins living in a colony in South Africa.
- Africa is also home to gorillas, Nile crocodiles and the world's largest chameleons.
