As Writers, we will read and appraise poetry with figurative language, and write our own winter poems using similes and metaphors. Use Talk for Writing (*Manchester Ridge-back*) to write chronological reports. We will also use Talk for Writing to write a portal story: *Clock Close*.

As Readers we will read *Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets* by JK Rowling .

As Mathematicians, we will develop our understanding of fractions. We will learn efficient methods for calculation using the four operations (+, -, x, ÷). We will develop our problem solving and reasoning skills, focussing on multiplication and division.

As Scientists We will be studying properties of materials, including solubility and investigating reversible changes.

As Historians we will be looking at key beliefs throughout history from the Stone Age to the 17th Century. We will also learn about beliefs in Ancient civilisations.

As Geographers we will describe and understand human and physical geography by studying South America using the book 'amazing rivers' to further develop our understanding.

As designers we will learn to design and make a motorised car, create circuits using electronics kits that employ a number of components and cut materials with precision and refine the finish with appropriate tools

As artists we will be looking at the artwork of different cultures and creating our own batik.

As Musicians, we will be using Sparkyard to develop an understanding of inter-related dimensions and musical vocabulary and improvise musical patterns while exploring jazz.

In P.E. use the Real PE program to focus our physical development in Real Dance and Real gym.

In Computing, we will develop our understanding databases and game creator.

In R.E. we will answer the following questions: How significant is it for Christians to believe that God intended Jesus to die? How are sacred teachings and stories interpreted by Jews today?

In PHSE we follow the Archbishops award and complete tasks in the local community.

In Spanish we will learn to speak about the weather and answer the question what is the date.
