Pollution





In Beijing there was lots of **pollution** in the air.

The pollution is caused by the large amounts of traffic releasing exhaust fumes into the air. It is often called smog.

To help the air pollution, Beijing reduces the number of cars that are allowed into the city each day by allowing only certain types of cars.

There are many different types of transport to get around the city.


