First, let's look at some castles in the UK.


Windsor Castle, England








Edinburgh Castle, Scotland

Belfast Castle, Northern Ireland








What did you notice about the location of those 4 castles?

The Norman's in Normandy, France were the first people to build castles during the Norman Conquest. They appeared sometime after 1066AD – known as the middle ages.



The Normans needed to build their castles quickly – sometimes in just a few days so at first they used earth and wood which was easily available and quick to use. Using this method they could build Motte and Bailey castles in 2 weeks.

William the Conquer was the first Norman King of England and during his reign over 60 of these castles were built all over England – their remains can still be seen.

Where's the best place to build a castle?



Habitation – you need to protect locals and use their labour



Woodland - Essential for wood supplies: Weapons, hoarding, drawbridges, fuel for fires, etc.



High Mountains – Protection from the weather; difficult for enemies to reach you; hard to see over and build upon.



Low Hills – Some protection from the weather; fairly easy to see enemy approaching; water will drain down into a basin.



Marshy Ground – Difficult to build on – poor foundations; can be a source of illness.

Location was very important when building a castle.


Other things to think about:

Main Roads bring in supplies and reinforcements; you need to protect main routes in your area.

Rivers for: drinking water; cleaning water; possible water defenses; streams running from it; natural barriers.




Which site did you choose?

Scottish rebels joined forces with the Vikings and attacked from the sea. They cut off your supply lines and starved your people. You are dead!




Did you choose site B?

Your castle was too heavy and began to sink into the marshy land.


Disease from the marsh killed many of your people.

Did you choose site C?



Did you choose site D?


Scottish rebels from the north reached Maintown and took control before you realised. The land you built on was too flat to see them coming.
