We would like to say a warm welcome to all our families, as we begin a new year at Ludlow Primary School.


The children have had a very positive start to the new term, enjoying their learning in their new classrooms and demonstrating excellent behaviour.

School Opening Hours

School opens at 8.40am Registration is at 8.50am School ends at 3.15pm (Reception 3pm)

Total time: this amounts to 32.5 hours in a typical week.

Please note:

There will be staff supervision on the gate at our Clee View site from 8:30am daily. Gates on both sites will open at 8:40am and locked at 8:50am.

Children arriving after this time will need to enter through the main reception of both sites.

Children who attend Breakfast Club need to arrive for 8:10am at Clee View and 8.15 at Sandpits Road. They will be admitted through the main reception door at Clee View and into Tree tops at Sandpits Road.
